



# ENROLMENT POLICY

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## 2. Vision Statement

Guided by our Catholic Identity, St Brigid's College ensures high levels of learning and success for all.

## 3. Rationale

*"...Catholic schools are still central to the mission and work of the Catholic Diocese of Ballarat today and to the life quality of students and their families. Inspired and governed by the message and person of Jesus Christ, and committed to the physical, intellectual, social and spiritual development of each person, they provide education of the highest quality to their communities. In line with the self-understanding of the Church, they are welcoming to all who share their educational philosophy. Through their distinctive educational style, Catholic schools make an irreplaceable contribution to the intellectual, ethical and spiritual wellbeing of their own community and of Australian society."*

#### **4. Policy Statement**

Catholic children living in the community of Ss. Michael and John's Parish will normally have the right to a place in St Brigid's College.

St Brigid's College is welcoming to those families who may not be Catholic but who share the understanding of the Catholic school described above. Admission is open to non-Catholic students provided admission does not compromise the ethos, practices and religious education programs of the College.

#### **5. Guiding Principles**

- The Catholic Diocese of Ballarat upholds the principle that all Catholic students wishing to enroll in a Catholic school will have an enrolment place.
- All enrolments will be subject to the discretion of the Principal and based upon the best interests of all concerned. Current State and Federal legislation states that the intellectual and physical capacity of the student is not a criterion of entry to the school.
- All students will be expected to participate in the Religious Education program at all levels.
- Students other than Catholics will be considered for enrolment provided this does not result in the exclusion of Catholic students. All parents will be required to give an understanding that they will respect the life, nature and identity of the school.
- Enrolment is ongoing provided the College expectations continue to be met, including but not limited to payment of school fees and levies, student attendance and conduct, and continued support of the ethos and philosophy of the College. It must be pointed out that no student will be excluded from the school or school activities because of non-payment of such fees and levies.
- Children with special needs who can be catered for in the regular classroom will be considered for enrolment upon the recommendation of an integrated support group, convened by the Principal, specifically to examine the ability of the College to meet those needs.

#### **6. Criteria for Enrolments**

The Principal, will be informed by, but not restricted to the following order of criteria:

1. Catholic students from Ss. Michael and John's Catholic Primary School and OLHC, Murtoa.
2. Siblings of present students or of past students who have completed their education at St Brigid's College.
3. Sons and daughters of current staff members.
4. Catholic students who have completed their sacraments of initiation and are enrolled at State or Independent schools.
5. Non-Catholic students who have been at Catholic Primary schools.
6. Children of other Christian denominations who, in conjunction with their parents, display willingness to support the ethos and philosophy of the College.
7. Non-Christian students who, in conjunction with their parents, display a willingness to support the ethos and philosophy of the College.

It is expected that by following this Policy, St Brigid's College will have clear enrolment guidelines which will assist all parents in the responsibility of educating their children in the Faith in partnership with the College.

## 7. Responsibilities

The Principal has the authority and is ultimately responsible for the implementation of this Policy.
