## Parent Access Module (PAM)

To support all our students as learners, I encourage families to go to the Parent Access Module (PAM). PAM can be found on the front page of our College website. Within PAM you can see the student timetable, but more importantly the Learning Areas tab on the left which brings up your child's subjects where you can click on these to see when their assessments are due. This is very significant as you are able to help your child be proactive in their submission of work. It also allows the parent to see the feedback provided by the teachers and look for areas of improvement in the future. Try and build a regular look at PAM into your weekly schedule.

Parents are asked to advise the Front Office (53823545) Option 1 by 8.40am if their child will be absent from school that day. Messages may also be left on the school answering machine. Should a student not be present at homeroom or Period 1 and has not completed a late pass, then a text message will be sent to parents' mobiles seeking clarification of the absence.






